



"Trick or Treat" Others with Respect
Halloween can be fun. However, we need to be aware that celebrating Halloween needs to be fun for ALL and not at the expense of equity seeking groups. Halloween offers an opportunity to have meaningful conversations in families about costume choices. In doing so, it is important to keep in mind that we need to be sensitive to groups that have been marginalized through mimicry and cultural appropriation during Halloween and other 'dress up' events.

It's good to keep in mind that the following are NOT Costumes:

-RACE (black face/brown face)
-CULTURE (Indigenous regalia/dreadlocks)
-RELIGIOUS FAITH (religious
figures/gods/saints/gurus/hijab)
-GENDER (gender switching for humour or to mock)
-TRAUMA (hangman's noose/weapons)

All costumes must adhere to the Richmond School
District's Code of Conduct. Costumes that obscure faces,
and replica weapons are NOT allowed at school and
should be left at home. If you are unsure about a costume,
please speak to Ms. Schulz or Ms. Lee.

Richmond School District 38 is excited to welcome kindergarten registration applications for children born in 2018, turning 5 in 2023. These children will begin kindergarten in September 2023. Online registration opens on November 1, 2022. Please visit our website http://www.sd38.bc.ca/kindergarten for more information about our online registration process, required documents, important dates and FAQs.

Families are encouraged to register any time during the Priority 1 registration period (November – January) for the best chance at attending their catchment school. All registration applications received any time during the Priority 1 registration period will receive placement decisions by February 3, 2023.

Instead of in person information evenings this year, we have posted short videos that provide our new parents with information about the registration process, English Language Learner (ELL) assessments, and District Program Options – Early French Immersion and Montessori. PARKING LOT SAFETY REMINDERS




Reminders of where to park and where to stop your car and drop off.









Many families are choosing to park in the drop off zone at the front of the school. Parking is leaving your car to walk your child to class. When a car is parked in that zone, it causes back ups for all of our families and make it unsafe for others exiting the parking lot. PLEASE PAR YOUR CAR IN A DESIGNATED SPOT AND WALK YOUR CHILD FROM THERE.



HOLD AND SECURE DRILL

Blundell will be taking part in their annual HOLD AND SECURE Drill. This drill helps us to prepare for an emergency threat that may happen outside of the school in our neighbourhood, for example a broken gas line or threat in the area. During this scenario, students remain in their classroom and all students and staff outside are directed back into the school building. Learning activities occur in classrooms and we follow the direction of the RCMP. When the situation is resolved an ALL CLEAR is given and the HOLD AND SECURE is complete.
